

Arts Integrative Interdisciplinary Research (AiiR) grants are available to graduate students in good academic standing and currently enrolled in any graduate degree granting program (inclusive of, but not limited to MA, MFA, MM, EdD, DMA, or PhD), and actively progressing toward that degree in one of the ArtsEngine schools or colleges (A. Alfred Taubman College of Architecture + Urban Planning; College of Engineering; Penny W. Stamps School of Art & Design; School of Information; School of Music, Theatre & Dance) at the University of Michigan.

These grants are designed to support graduate student research projects that integrate the arts and design with other disciplines, especially those in engineering and the sciences:

- To produce new knowledge;
- As part of a process of systematic questioning and inquiry;
- As a mode of creative activity and scholarship;
- In the exploration and discovery of processes, information, applications, ideas or performances;
- In the investigation of a subject area, as part of experimentation, and making.

Projects will be judged according to the degree to which each contributing discipline is utilized to support the novel interdisciplinary outcome and the extent to which the investigator, individually or in collaboration with others, demonstrates the disciplinary knowledge and skills required to complete the project.

The Letter of Intent (LOI) is an initial request for project review, prior to submitting a full application. LOIs that meet basic criteria will prompt either an invitation to submit the full application to the granting committee or an invitation to a pre-application consultation to work on the project to better meet grant criteria.

If a project falls too far outside the grant criteria, LOI submitters will receive written feedback toward a resubmission at a later time or suggestions about other possible sources of funding. All LOIs will receive a response within two weeks of submission deadlines.
